He has recently been involved in cases of aviation accidents in Antarctica, RAF aerobatic accidents and claims arising from terrorist attacks in London.

One of Nick's special interests (both in practice and as an academic) is biotechnology and development particularly in respect of prosthetics and advanced biomedical responses to acquired injury.

Nick has extensive experience of fatal accident cases, appearing at inquests and acting for both claimants and defendants in high profile cases.

Nick's military caseload has included mountaineering training accidents in Africa, catastrophic accidents in SAS training exercises on the Brecon Beacons and in Snowdonia and fatal or claims arising from the suffering of injuries of the utmost severity in Bosnia, Iraq, Afghanistan and in Europe.
